Sec. Martin Harrison called the meeting to order following the National Anthem and welcomed attending guests.



The Hua Hin Hospital Neurological Unit is looking for support!

Prior to starting the Club Assembly, P Phil welcomed Dr Sarun Jotkasthira and two of his nursing colleagues from the new neurological unit of Hua Hin Hospital. In August 2022 a new Neurological unit was opened at a cost of 80 million baht, much of this money was donated by the late Rama 9 King. However, budgets for new hospital equipment have

been severely cut following the Covid-19 pandemic, therefore much needed items of equipment to enable the day to day running of the unit were required. This new unit not only provides essential treatment for people



in Hua Hin, but also the neighboring provinces of Chumphon and Phetchaburi, and has been used extensively since it's opening.

Dr Jotikasthira met with PP Napa and President Phil Lawrence and expressed the hospitals need for the following equipment.

• Dual Flouro program with biplane costs for new license 700,000 Thai Baht

• Touch Screen Tablet with Installation 200,000 Thai Baht



The cost of these two items is 900,000 Thai Baht and would need the permission from our members as our club policy is that with any purchase over 200,000 Thai Baht our members would have a vote whether we proceed or not.

According to P Phil, there are currently 2 possible interested beneficiaries and a project proposal has been sent and is currently under review. A response is due back from the beneficiary in the near future.

Pilot Course Water Safety Drowning Prevention Project finally gets wet!



Members of the Rotary Club of Royal Hua Hin led by the Water safety chair CP Alan Cooper, Rotarian Kamolthip Sangsripet Pettit, and President Phil Lawrence welcomed the Mayor of Hua Hin Mr Nopporn Wutthikul, Mr Theeraphan Jadpol who is the Director of Public Health and Environment presented the certificates of successful training to the instructors.



Following the successful training of 10 volunteer Instructors from Hua Hin by an Australian team of professional instructors in Phuket at the end of February and the beginning of March, the first pilot course of the Water Safety Drowning Prevention program was run with 55 students from the Ban Bo Fai school.

It is anticipated that this pilot course will be the start of a successful project here in Hua Hin to help raise the awareness of the dangers of swimming in water, and how to understand how to protect themselves.


How do we progress our Membership?
